#### Welcome to Week 39 for 2024 at The Lighthouse Toowoomba

As always in The Beacon there is so much to share with you, it has been a fortnight of highs and lows. The highs are entirely possible because of your enduring support, so let's start with the good news!

\* We had the most remarkable experience for the launch of the Parliamentary Friends of Children's Literacy in Canberra, realising the possibility of what could be when we all unite to a common cause.

\* Any minute now we expect a delivery of 4,000 locally

printed books created by children, to be gifted to children, taking our threeyear total of 14,218 books rehomed. That's right you read correctly - a delivery of 4000! We can hardly believe it! Already today the authors from Year 6 St Saviour's had a chance to 'unbox' their book Maverick, and sign copies (above) ready for the launch on Monday.

\* So we invite you do drop in any time after the 11th November to pick up copies of those new books for the little ones in your world <sup>(c)</sup> Think of how lovely it would be to share unique locally made Christmas gifts!

Now for the not so good **news** – we were not successful with our big Federal grant application which included your generous and thoughtful letter of support. We are doing everything the government asks of us in the grant outcomes, yet the sticking point is the eligible funding, hence missing the assessment criteria. This grant will pay for plasterers, painters, electricians, and builders, but not for the sheer man-power required to keep the doors open for us to provide the workshops, events, opportunities, mentoring, books, and support that we do.

You know, along with you, we were incredibly optimistic about this grant given our intended three year trial has indeed yielded a truly relevant shovel ready, low risk plan AND the grant application stated 'we may also approve other activities which are linked to the objectives of the program'.

But we are not ones to despair...but rather ask ourselves 'Where to from here?'


And that's where you come in!

And from our end, we will continue to do everything we can to ensure opportunities for children in our region, doing everything we can to ensure they read, write, and create with confidence, and we will continue to also submit grant applications at state, local, and private foundation levels. We have until the end of June 2025 to secure significant funding, and promise you, not a second is to be wasted!

With only 61 days left of this year AND enthusiasm for planning for even half of 2025 we are STILL IN THE GAME!

## Made to Move

The next exhibition in The Write Gallery, Made to Move, opens on Saturday 16th November at 4:00pm with a very special event, and more information will be shared in our next newsletter!

Made to Move is the brainchild of Nadine Reynolds. Nadine first started capturing the images children made in her artwork in "Sewing the Seeds of Love" emulating her daughters' early drawings.

In "Made to Move" she has worked with 15 young artists to create artworks which capture a moment in time, honouring this stage of their lives. Nadine says she has learned as much from these artists as from the more 'famous' works. "I am so excited to be working with The Lighthouse to promote children's creativity and literacy in Toowoomba. I have been teaching for over 35 years and I can't think of a better way to give back to the community which has looked after me."

#### Why "Made to move?"

"Well, the artworks are silk. They move as you walk past them. Children are always on the move. I love that they are dynamic."

This program brought valuable insights to students and enriched their understanding of our local environment.








## Author Visit to Ramsay School

Next week we have not one, not two, BUT THREE book launches going on!


On **4 November** we are proud to launch of 'Maverick', a wonderfully collaborative children's book recognising the importance of sun protection and being sun safe in the outdoors.

We are so grateful for this donation and are looking forward to bundling them up and sending them on to local schools to be read again and again!




