A sneak peek into this edition:



About John Collee

Formerly a foreign-aid doctor and medical journalist, John has written movies in almost every genre, including action/adventure such as **Master and Commander** (2003), family sagas - **The Patriarch** (2016), **Wolf Totem** (2015), and bigbudget animation such as **Happy Feet** (2006) and **Walking with Dinosaurs** (2013).

His films, often co-written with their respective directors, have three times been nominated for Oscars: **Master and Commander** for Best Film, **Happy Feet** for Best Animation, and the Vanuatubased love story, **Tanna**, for Best Foreign Language Feature.

Several of John's previous films have shown at TIFF, including his Charles Darwin biopic **Creation** which opened the festival in 2009 and his terrorist drama, **Hotel Mumbai**, which was a hit of the festival in 2018. He also co-wrote last-year's **Lee** (TIFF 2023), about war correspondent Lee Miller, with Kate Winslet in the lead role.

Having recently adapted the seven-part **Boy Swallow's Universe** for Netflix and co-written a fight movie, **Monkey Man**, with Dev Patel, he is attending this year's festival as co-writer of **The Return** (2024) about the return of Odysseus to Ithaca, starring Ralph Fiennes and Juliette Binoche.

Here is his response when we reached out and asked about his advice to writers:

"One of the things which struck me at the recent AACTA awards was that a lot of the best writing which comes out of Australia, (actually the best writing from anywhere) derives from real life experience. As a writer starting out you tend to think of daily life with its many problems as an obstruction to the creative process - the difficult business of raising kids or managing a family or making a living in a chaotic world. But actually, Boy Swallows Universe was all about domestic problems. Utopia is about tedious office culture, the brilliant "Bluey" is all about raising small kids and "Colin from Accounts" is all about the impossibility of finding a work-life balance. That's really the core of my message to aspiring writers use those irritations to make pearls - everything you think of as getting in the way of a creative life is actually your story, if you merely adjust your perspective slightly."



Oh to be published... another opportunity for aspiring writers

Di Bates is a writer of over 150 books and *Winner, Winner, Winner* is her latest project. Di is also the curator of the Buzz Words monthly industry newsletter. Now that 'Pass it On' curated by Jackie Hosking has folded, this is the only one that comprehensively covers books for children and YA audiences, industry opportunities, publishers open for submission, and insights into the writing process. 
It is our non-negotiable, wanting to ensure every child in Australia reads, writes, and creates with confidence.
